

- State based conflict
 - At least 25 battle deaths
 - At least two organized parties, one of which is a government
 - Politically motivated dispute
- Doesn't include
 - Organized crime
 - One sided repression or massacres




Location of conflict events 2024








Ten conflicts with highest battle deaths 2020-2025






Growing internationalization of civil conflict






Higher intensity of recent internationalized civil conflict






Growing complexity of civil conflict





Underlying cause: Role of Islamist groups – IS and JNIM





Underlying cause: World is more autocratic

- Autocrats involve
 - -Fewer checks on war from legislatures or courts
 - 'Strong men' want to be seen to be militaristic and aggressive
 - -May support each other
 - But lots of opportunism and disputes



Underlying cause: Great power conflict

- China, Russia etc challenge the global order
 - Global calls for change without supporting war
- Direct fighting, eg Ukraine War

Involvement in conflicts, eg Mali



Proximate causes

- Decline in effectiveness of the UN and regional organizations
 - Reduced peacekeeping, conflict prevention and mediation
- Decline in respect for international law
 - Break laws themselves, allow others to do so
- Increased external involvement
 - Internationalization, and also arms supplies
- Insurgencies against autocratic leaders
 - Lack of peaceful means of resistance



State of arms control

- Key US Russia nuclear arms process have broken down
- Russia has undermined implementation of multilateral treaties
 - Ignored commitments
 - Disrupted conferences
- US has failed to implement or support agreements (JCOPA, CTBT)
- Withdrawal from Mine Ban Treaty by Poland, Finland and Baltic states
- Discussions on acquiring nuclear weapons (South Korea, Poland etc)
- But many states and civil society expresses support for existing agreements



Future for arms control?

- Possible to have agreements among adversaries
 - Cold War progress soon after Cuba
 - Don't have to trust if can verify

- But, strategic arms control is a means to achieve stability
 - Russia, China etc want change

- But, humanitarianism isn't being prioritized
 - eg preparing for use of landmines
