

ECRL News Update – January 2026

Message from our President

Dear members of ECRL, Dear sisters and brothers, peace and grace be with you all.

We are entering a new year at a time when the language of power is loud. Too often it is spoken through weapons, through threats, through the clenched fist. In such a world, hope is sometimes dismissed as naïve, and faith as private, even irrelevant. Yet history tells a different story.

Svetlana Tsikhanouskaja, leader of the opposition in Belarus and speaking from the experience of life under an authoritarian regime, once said: *“People of faith are dangerous for all authoritarian systems. Dangerous not because they seek conflict, but because they are driven by something beyond themselves. Because they refuse to let fear have the final word. Because their loyalty is not absolute to any ruler, ideology, or state, but to a truth that transcends power.”*



The apostle Paul expresses it in another way in the Book of Hebrews: *“Faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen.”* Faith teaches us to see what is not yet visible. It gives substance to hope when circumstances argue against it. And that is why hope is a powerful resource in times like ours.

At the heart of the Christian story stands an image that challenges every authoritarian imagination of power: a child laid in a manger. God does not enter the world with an army, but with vulnerability. Power is revealed not in a clenched fist, but in a hand that gently touches a wounded face. Not in bombs that explode, but in hearts that keep beating.

And the Christian story does not end there. Hope flows from the empty tomb as well. From a grave that could not hold love captive. From a resurrection that proclaims that violence, injustice, and death do not have the last word. Hope is not escapism. It is resistance. It is courage shaped by compassion.

For us, as religious leaders, hope is not a soft alternative to “real” politics. It is its moral foundation. Hope changes how we speak, how we negotiate, how we decide. It reminds us that human dignity is not granted by states but recognized by them. It calls us to protect the vulnerable, to listen to the silenced, and to act when cynicism seems easier.

Hope becomes especially powerful when it is embodied. When people of faith do not stand alone, but act together. When prayer leads to practice, and conviction to cooperation. When communities refuse to mirror the violence they oppose.

May we all have hope in our hearts and courage in our thoughts, so we dare to imagine more than the world as it is. And may our faith, whatever tradition we come from, continue to make us “dangerous” to despair, to injustice, and to every system that denies the humanity of God’s children.

Council and Members' Activities


