

“A MOMENT OF TRUTH: FAITH IN A TIME OF GENOCIDE”
November 15, 2025

GLOBAL KAIROS FOR JUSTICE, an international Christian movement for the freedom and dignity of Palestinians and the human rights of all peoples around the world, is rooted in the document *A Moment of Truth* issued by Kairos Palestine in 2009.

Gathered in Bethlehem—in the midst of ethnic cleansing and genocide—Global Kairos for Justice (GKJ) unreservedly endorses the recently released, second Kairos Palestine document, *A Moment of Truth: Faith in a Time of Genocide*. We lament the loss of people, the land and the world’s moral compass. We name the realities that Palestinians are experiencing and insist that others use this vocabulary that describes these realities: settler colonialism, illegal occupation, apartheid, ethnic cleansing, and genocide.

We reject Jewish, Muslim and Christian Zionism—a political ideology, a theological distortion, and a moral corruption—in all its expressions: Jewish, Muslim and Christian. We commit to boycott dialogue with voices who promote occupation, apartheid and genocide. We reject the International Holocaust Remembrance Alliance’s (IHRA) definition of antisemitism and every attempt to weaponize the charge of antisemitism by equating it with resistance to apartheid and criticism of the State of Israel. We cannot serve God while allowing genocide.

With representatives of 23 countries—from South Africa to the Netherlands; from India to Brazil and Chile; from Germany to Canada and the U.S.—Global Kairos for Justice expands our call to include, among a longer list, the following:

- Pressure governments and encourage the global civil society to: isolate, boycott, divest from, and sanction Israel; insist that “third parties” assume their responsibilities to prevent genocide; and hold complicit governments accountable for their complicity;
- Affirm and partner with those of other faiths, organizations and persons of conscience who share our commitment to the Palestinian cause, who further the human rights of all peoples, and who insist on the implementation of international law and human rights conventions;
- Expose the growing fragmentation of Christians in historic Palestine and work to preserve the Christian presence in their homeland;
- Increase efforts to “Come and See” and return to bear witness;
- Commend the document for study and mobilization to realize the Palestinian vision:

“We look toward the day when we shall live free in our land, together with all the inhabitants of the earth, in true peace and reconciliation — founded upon justice and equality for all God’s creation, where „mercy and truth meet, and righteousness and peace kiss each other (Psalm 85:10).” “Kairos Palestine II A Moment of Truth: Faith in a Time of Genocide”
